



Third Rome



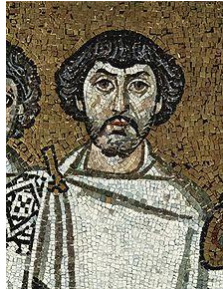
Area of dry grassland located in Eurasia where nomadic people lived and traded

Steppe



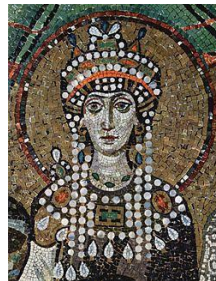
Nobleman who became the emperor of the Byzantine Empire

Belisarius



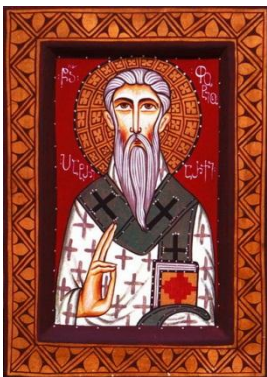
Wife and advisor of Justinian

Russian prince who created Russia's law code and built many churches

Nomads from Central Asia who conquered Russia

Mongols



Russian prince who ruled as "Grand Prince" under the Mongols

Vladimir



Known as "The Great;" Russian prince who challenged Mongol rule

Ivan III



Known as "The Terrible;" First to officially use the title of czar

Leader of the Mongols who conquered Russia
