
Japan is made up of a chain of islands called an <u>archipelago</u>. It has many <u>mountains</u> and has very little <u>farmable</u> land. Japan also experiences many <u>typhoons</u>, or strong tropical storms, and <u>earthquakes</u>. This is why the area is called the "Ring of Fire."

Early Japan


Early Japan was ruled by independent <u>clans</u>. The <u>Yamato</u> Clan eventually became the most powerful clan. Their leaders were called <u>emperors</u>, but had very little political power. The <u>military</u> leader had the real power.

<u>Shintoism</u>

Shintoism is a religion unique to **Japan** and became the state religion. It is a **polytheistic** religion, which means that they believed in many gods. These gods were called **<u>kami</u>**. They also worshipped their **<u>ancestors</u>**. Most people practiced Shintoism and **<u>Buddhism</u>**. The Japanese built many **<u>toriis</u>**, which were Shinto shrines.



Japanese culture was greatly influenced by nearby **China**.



By the 11th century, the **<u>Fujiwara</u>** family took control of Japan. Large landowners set up private **<u>armies</u>** and began to attack the **<u>countryside</u>**. This lead to the development of **<u>feudalism</u>** in Japan as small farmers traded their land for **<u>protection</u>**.
