

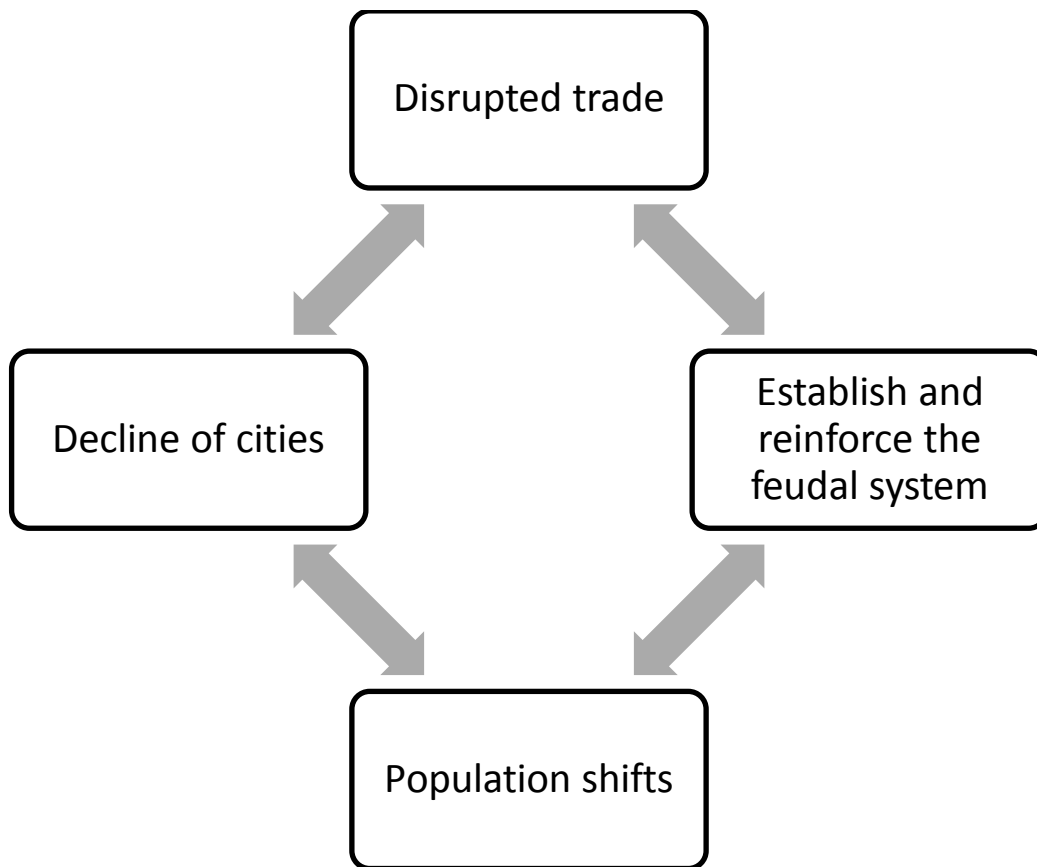
WHI.9d in a Nutshell



During the Early Middle Ages, many different groups invaded **Europe**. These invasions interrupted the social, economic, and political order of Europe.

These groups of invaders are called migratory groups because **they moved from place to place**.

These invasions influenced Europe in 4 ways:

Angles and Saxons

- Migrated from continental Europe to England
- Kingdoms included: Northumbria, Merica, and Wessex



Vikings

- Migrated from Scandinavia into Europe and Russia
- Known for their fast and unexpected raids
- Excellent sailors and navigators



Magyars

- Migrated from central Asia to Hungary
